From the Pastor's Desk

"You were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only don't let this freedom be an opportunity to indulge your selfish impulses, but serve each other through love." Galatians 5:13 CEB

Happy Summer! We are getting ushered into Minnesota summer with a Bang!! How many of you lost power during



our first big storm of the summer? It makes you more grateful for it when it is restored, and for those willing to work with electrical power to restore our homes connections to "the grid!"

Our prayers go out to the community of Greenfield and others hard hit by tornadoes.

So often we look at these situations and wonder what we can do. It is not easy and often not advisable to go to a disaster site to lend a helping hand, but we can offer aid through two different sources, one is One Great Hour of Sharing and the other is through the Presbyterian Mission website, <u>www.</u> <u>presbyterianmission.org</u> from here you click on donate, then category, then disaster relief, then they have a button for tornadoes! I heard that some of you said, that's a lot of work – not as much work as sawing up fallen trees, or removing fallen houses.

While your at the website look around they have <u>tons</u> of <u>information</u> and a number of ideas that we could explore see if something interests you.

If you don't want to give on line, but you would like to give to something to support the disaster relief, you can write a check and we'll send it in for you.

The scripture at the top of the page came from the Common English Bible, those same verses Galatians 5:13-15, from The Message are a little different;

"¹³⁻¹⁵ It is absolutely clear that God has called you to a free life. Just make sure that you don't use this freedom as an excuse to do whatever you want to do and destroy your freedom. Rather, use your freedom to serve one another in love; that's how freedom grows. For everything we know about God's Word is summed up in a single sentence: Love others as you love yourself. That's an act of true freedom. If you bite and ravage each other, watch out—in no time at all you will be annihilating each other, and where will your precious freedom be then?"

Oh if only we could get the whole world to read and understand this – wait a minute – Christians have a hard enough time understanding this – maybe we should just work on ourselves and see how that goes. Maybe we should start really small and just worry about ourselves individually, since the only person you can really change is yourself.

We can all influence others – and in fact we influence others every single day by the way that we interact with each other, in the way that we serve each other. From the minute we get out of bed in the morning until we lie down again at night and close our eyes, we are impacting the lives of those around us.

What type of service do we provide? What type of fruit are we serving? When we allow the Spirit of God into our lives we begin to experience and share the fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, kindness, goodness faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. As we deepen our relationship with God, as we get better at taking that deep breath before we respond to someone, in all circumstances, we get better at showing others what a life lived with God is like. By doing that, just living with God, you can lead someone else to a life with God.

The fruits of the Spirit are listed in Galatians 5:22-24 and I love the way The Message talks about them:


"But what happens when we live God's way? He brings gifts into our lives, much **the** same way that fruit appears in an orchard—things like affection for others, exuberance about life, serenity. We develop a willingness to stick with things, a sense **of** compassion in **the** heart, and a conviction that a basic holiness permeates things and people. We find ourselves involved in loyal commitments, not needing to force our way in life, able to marshal and direct our energies wisely. Legalism is helpless in bringing this about; it only gets in **the** way. Among those who belong to Christ, everything connected with getting our own way and mindlessly responding to what everyone else calls necessities is killed **off** for good—crucified."

What a gift it is to not have to respond to what everyone else calls a necessity of life. We don't have to have all the things that others say make you a success – God says you are enough right now.



"I praise you because I am fearfully and Wonderfully made; Your works are wonderful, I know that full well."


AROUND THE CHURCH


